Workshop Inputs

Responses to change:

- Sudden change / post disaster repairs
- Creeping change / adaptive management
- Long term future change /
 - growing requirements - altered availability

Sudden change: post disaster aspect

- Integrated with later reconstruction
- Local involvement
 - Secure confidence
 - Women / good ideas
- Reconstruction complexity

Creeping change

- Land use change
 - Problems
 - Responses
- Increasing water shortages
 - Water storage
 - Water transfers
 - Virtual water trade
 - Water + benefit sharing in transboundary rivers

Future change

- Vulnerability of coastal aquifers
- City water supply in Himalaya
- Water transfer
 - Siberian rivers
 - Indian north to south transfer

Conceptual development

- Green water as an eye opener
- Agriculture systems never blue only
 - New farmers in "green revolution" were rainfed

Personal Reflections

- Turning point in human history
- Interesting breakthroughs:
 - ET-control
 - Bottom-up approach in Jordan basin
 - Good Water Neighbours
 - Working with youths 12-15 years old

Distinctions

- Water use
 - Through-flow type
 - Truly consumptive
- Water sources
 - Blue: in rivers and aquifers
 - Green: infiltrated rain in soil
- Gender balance:
 - Women as users
 - Women as stakeholders
 - Women as professionals
